

ROCKLEDGE BOROUGH COUNCIL
COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES
OF
August 25, 2008

The Rockledge Borough Council met at 7:30 p.m. on August 25, 2008 at the Rockledge Borough Hall. After the prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance were recited, the roll was called as follows: Mr. Caffrey, Mr. Beady, Mr. Casey, Mrs. Kain and Mrs. Kehoe.

Law and Planning: Mr. Beady advised that there is a Zoning Hearing scheduled for Wednesday, August 27, 2008 at 7:30 p.m. regarding the property located at 9 Huntingdon Pike. The applicant is seeking a sign variance.

Finance: Mr. Casey advised that there is a Pension meeting scheduled for September 18, 2008.

Public Service: Mrs. Kain had nothing at this time.

Mr. Caffrey asked Mrs. Kain that when she does the next newsletter if she could put in there for residents that the borough ordinance requires that recyclables be put out no earlier than 8:00 p.m. It should not be put out at 3:00 in the afternoon.

Mrs. Kehoe asked about an ordinance for election signs. Mrs. Metzinger advised her that the Borough Ordinance states that a sign can be placed on a lawn 30 days before the election, and must be removed 2 days after the election.

Public Safety: Mrs. Kain wanted to remind everyone that Crime Night Out is on Sunday, September 7, 2008 at 4:00 p.m.

Chief Leary just wanted to remind everyone about Crime Night Out and Mrs. Kain covered that. Many more cars are expected this year. The pike will be closed the whole length of the Borough this year to accommodate the cars
